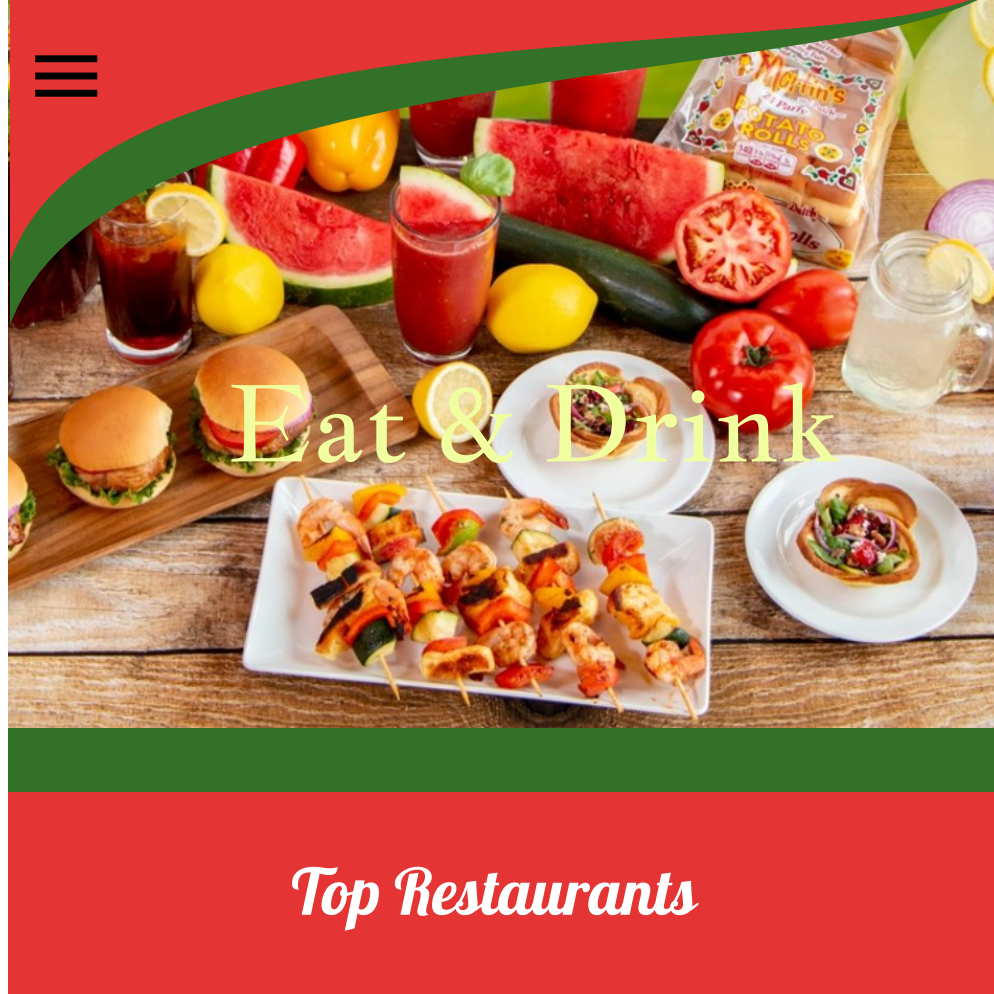

## Top Attraction

### 1. Colosseum

As there is Eiffel Tower in Paris, Colosseum is the charm and symbol of ancient power of Rome. This magnificent building, largest ruin at rome, was built around 72 AD by the architect Vespasian, being inaugurated 80 AD. This stadium's largest size was used for festivals, theatrical performances, circuses, gladiatorial games, ship fights, etc. The high officials had the first floor reserved, the aristocrats in the second, and normal citizens in third and fourth floor.

Go directly to the Colosseum's Fast Track Ticket Holders counter to queue for mandatory security checks. This lane is marked with a sign "Ticket Holder and Roma Pass."

##### Know before you go

- Please note the seasonal opening hours of the attractions and take this into account if you are selecting an admission time in the evening, so as to have enough time for your visit; the last entrance is 1 hour before closing time
- The ticket is valid for 24 hours and includes 1 entry to the Colosseum at the selected time slot and entry to the Roman Forum and Palatine Hill for 24-hours
- The entry time to each attraction can be moved within 1 hour depending on availability

##### Opening hours of the sites:

- From February 16 to March 15: 8:30 AM–5 PM
- From March 16 to the last Saturday of March: 8:30 AM–5:30 PM
- From the last Sunday of March to August 31: 8:30 AM– 7:15 PM
- From September 1 to September 30: 8:30 AM– 7 PM
- From October 1 to the last Saturday of October: 8:30 AM–6:30 PM
- From the last Sunday of October until February 15: 8:30 AM–4:30 PM

### 2. The Pantheon

The Pantheon - the best-preserved monument of Roman antiquity - is remarkably intact for its 2000 years. This is despite the fact that Pope Gregory III removed the gilded bronze roof tiles, and Pope Urban VIII ordered its bronze roof stripped and melted down to cast the canopy over the altar in St. Peter's and cannons for Castel Sant'Angelo.

The Pantheon was rebuilt after damage by fire in AD 80, and the resulting brickwork shows the extraordinarily high technical mastery of Roman builders. Its 43-meter dome, the supreme achievement of Roman interior architecture, hangs suspended without visible supports – these are well hidden inside the walls – and its nine-meter central opening is the building's only light source. #### TIPS

##### Visiting the Pantheon on Your Own

This is one of the top tourist attractions in the city, so it can get crowded in the summer. For a better chance of seeing it without crowds, plan to go early in the morning (it opens at 8:30am) or late. It stays open until 7:30pm and until 6pm on Sunday. Admission is free.

##### Photographing the Pantheon

The best light is around noon, when the sun shines through the oculus. The most dramatic view in the Pantheon is taken from directly beneath the oculus, aiming straight up. Don't try this on a rainy day!

##### For Your Safety

On rainy days be careful of the floor, which can be slippery when it's wet.
